

Priest's Tidings

On this Feast of the Holy Family we think of all the Christian families. Are there holy families outside the one of Nazareth? Yes, there are, each in its own unique way, if the members, parents and children, love and respect one another and let God nourish and deepen their affection; yes, if food and joy and cares are shared; yes, if clashes are resolved in a way that lets people grow together in forgiveness and understanding; yes, there are holy families where the door is open in hospitality and where the Lord himself is welcomed in people who are poor and suffering. It is the Lord himself who welcomes us here today.

In today's celebration of the Holy Family our Christian families are given a model. In many ways the Holy Family of Nazareth was unique and impossible to imitate. Today's scriptures stress one way in which all our families can follow them: seeking God's will and obeying it and finding joy and happiness in it even when that will demand sacrifices. Jesus is shown as someone who, from the child he was at Christmas, grew up to full maturity and who would carry out God's will to the very end. Like him, may we grow to maturity in our faith and our love.

A reading from the letter to the Colossians.

Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. Gospel Reading

Hear the The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Every year the parents of Jesus went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Assuming that he was in the group of travellers, they went a day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his

mother said to him, 'Child, why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have been searching for you in great anxiety.'

He said to them, 'Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?' But they did not understand what he said to them. Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favour.

Prayer and Meditation

After the events surrounding Jesus' miraculous birth we are given very few details about his childhood. This passage in Luke and another recorded in Matthew 2 (which we will read next Sunday) are the only two glimpses we are given.

As pious Jews, Mary and Joseph along with their relatives and friends, make their annual pilgrimage to Jerusalem. The occasion is the weeklong Passover festival honouring God for saving and delivering their forefathers from Egypt (Exodus 12·1-27)

It was a trip they had made many times before. This year, however, proved to be particularly memorable. Instead of returning with everyone else Jesus, who at the age of twelve was probably on his first pilgrimage, remained behind in the temple.

When Joseph and Mary realise Jesus is not with their group they return to Jerusalem. After three anxious days searching they finally find him talking to the religious teachers in the

temple!

Jes'us appears to have been completely absorbed, spending four days at the temple. He was in his element; listening to the religious teachers and asking them questions. What stunned his listeners was his wisdom and understanding, far beyond his age and learning. There was clearly something special about this boy. It was a prophetic sign, giving a glimpse of who Jesus really is.

Mary and Joseph are understandably upset that Jesus didn't return home

with them after the festival and caused them all this worry. Jesus' reply indicates that he took it for granted they would know where to find him; in the temple – 'in my Father's house'.

Mary and Joseph plainly didn't understand Jesus' words or actions although Mary 'treasured all these things in her heart'. After this event Luke tells us Jesus returned with them to Nazareth and was obedient to them. He grew up, increased in wisdom and gained favour with both God and man.

Meditatio:

• What does this passage reveal to us about the twelve-year-old Jesus' thoughts regarding himself and his heavenly father?

 What does this passage tell us about Jesus' priorities? How would this be reflected in his

future ministry?

 Jesus could have experienced God's presence anywhere. Why do you think he chose to go to the temple on this occasion?

Oratio:

We might capture something of Jesus' joy at being in his Father's house by praying the words of Psalm 84:2-9.

Today's passage focuses on family relationships with both our heavenly Father and our human family. Give thanks to God that you too are his child. Take time to pray for members of your church and of your own family.

Comtemplatio:

The verses in 1 John 3:1-2, 21-24 contain some amazing truths. Allow the wonder of a loving God who calls you his child to fill you.

Consider God's promisé that we can live in union with him if we obey him.
